Winter Snow Clearing on Bike Trails

Dear Property Owner,

TCPUD will be regularly clearing snow on the bike trail from Cathedral Dr. just south of Tahoe House Bakery, through Lakeside Trail in Tahoe City, and continue from Tahoe City to Dollar Point Entrance. The trail will be cleared between December and March to allow for bike and pedestrian use all winter. This service, which began last winter will enhance pedestrian safety, allow for bike usage, and provide an alternate transportation option through town.

Businesses and residents are not permitted to store snow on this section of bike trail and will be required to find alternate storage for the winter months.

In order for TCPUD to be successful and efficient in providing this additional recreational opportunity, it is essential that everyone along this 3.78 mile section of bike trail not store snow on the bike trail. If you have a snow removal service, please communicate with your contractor about this change. Also, TCPUD does provide a snow storage site on Fairway Drive if there is a need due to this change. You can have your snow removal contractor contact us if you are interested in that option.

RESOLUTION NO. 16-31
OF
TAHOE CITY PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT
AMENDING PORTION OF ORDINANCE 248
REVISION OF RECREATIONAL USE PERIOD APPLICABLE TO BIKE TRAIL
SNOW STORAGE AND REMOVAL

WHEREAS, at a Board meeting held November 21, 2003, the Board of Directors of Tahoe City Public Utility District adopted Ordinance 248 for the storage of snow and removal of stored snow from Districts bicycle, pedestrian and recreational trails system, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors determine that all or a portion of the District's Trails System and Trail System Area may not be used for the storage of snow from Adjoining Property.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TAHOE CITY PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT as follows;


That the 3.28 mile portion of the District trail system and trail system area from the most easterly intersection of State Route 28 and Lake Forest Road, west through Tahoe City and south on State Route 89 to Cathedral Drive may not be used for snow storage from adjoining property.

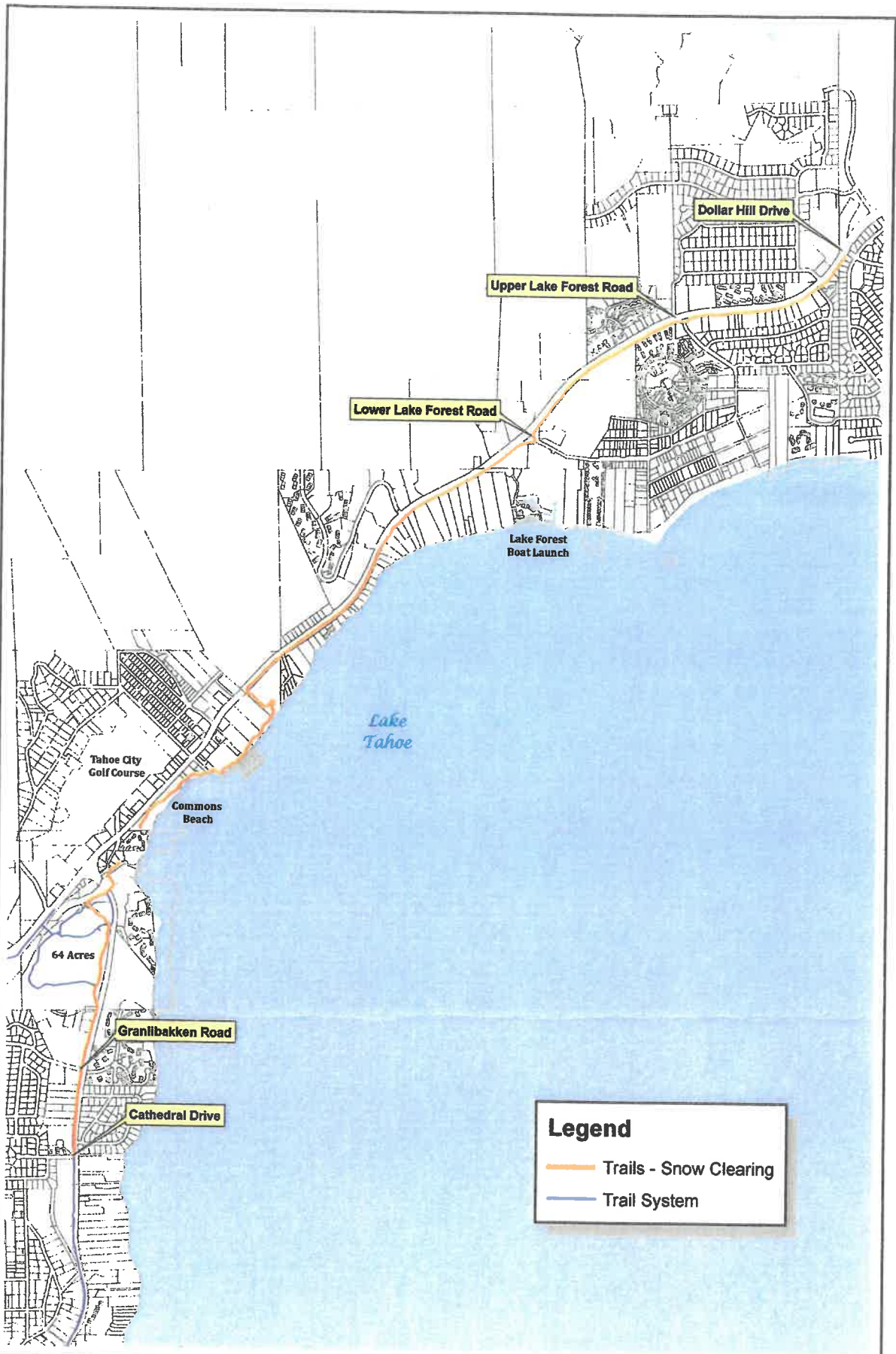
