Golf Course Irrigation Replacement Begins in May

\$2.1 Million investment will save water and improve the golfing experience.

WHAT: Contractors for TCPUD are planning in May to begin work on replacing the **Tahoe City Golf Course irrigation system**.

The new system will be more water efficient, have improved turf coverage, and provide a better golf experience for customers.

WHY: The irrigation system at Tahoe City Golf Course has been in place since 1976, well beyond the typical 30-year lifespan for mountain environments.

Thanks to ongoing maintenance, it has lasted longer than expected, but it's time for a full replacement.

WHEN: Construction will commence in May 2025 and is expected to be complete by mid-September 2025.

WHAT TO EXPECT: There will be associated heavy equipment and some construction noise in the area. TCPUD is committed to minimizing disruptions during the 2025 golf season. However, golfers can expect that at least one hole at a time will be closed.

2.4 Miles of West Shore Trail to be Reconstructed in 2025



TCPUD is investing \$4.8 million to reconstruct 2.4 miles of trail between Sunnyside and Blackwood Creek.

Originally built in the 1970s, the West Shore Trail has benefited from TCPUD's regular maintenance, but after nearly 50 years, a full reconstruction is necessary.

The project will improve:

- Pavement integrity and safety
- Slope and alignment for a smoother ride
- Visibility for pedestrians and vehicles
- ADA compliance
- Drainage and erosion control

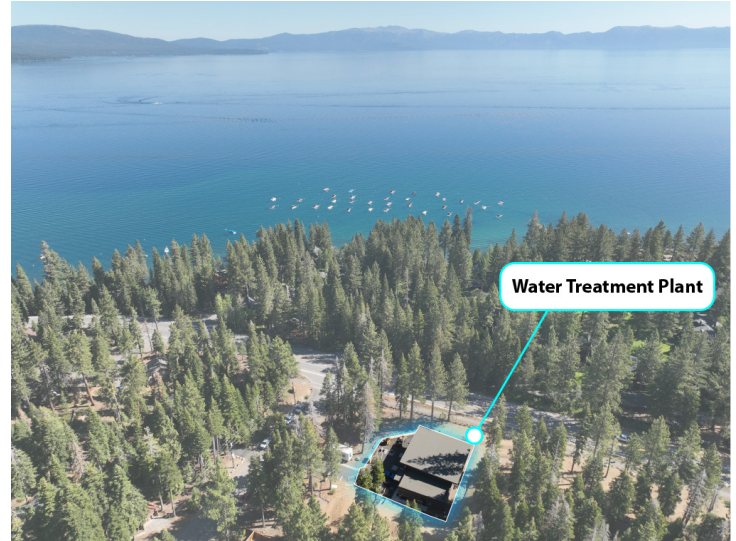
Trail Impacts

During peak construction, the trail may experience full closures. However, on weekends and from June 28 to July 13, the trail will either remain open or have detour options available.

Progress on West Lake Tahoe Water Treatment Plant Continues



Work continues to bring the new West Lake Tahoe Regional Water Treatment Plant online, with full operation expected in Summer 2025.

The new water treatment plant replaces a temporary facility in Chambers Landing. The new plant will provide a permanent, drought-resistant drinking water source from Lake Tahoe and support improved fire suppression capacity.
