Shoreline Plan

- Ensures boating and shoreline activities do not harm Lake Tahoe
- What qualifies as a water-oriented concession?

Eligibility

- Landowner as permittee
- Demonstrate the activity is an appropriate use for its location
- Motorized concessions need to be operated in marinas in most cases



How this applies to Lake Forest Boat Ramp:

- No existing TRPA permitted concessions operating at Lake Forest Boat Ramp
- In most cases, concessions will need to operate out of a separate marina
- Concessions permitted at other locations can be launched and retrieved at Lake Forest Boat Ramp
- Operating at a site vs. launching and retrieving



Permitting/Application Process

- Find an appropriate area for operation
- Landowner permission to operate
- Submit a complete application jointly with the landowner
- Planner assignment and review
- Permits remain valid so long as permit conditions continue to be met

Business License Regulations for Commercial Vessel Operators

Business license reviewed/issued <u>after</u> TRPA permit issued

Business License Application Process

- Apply: https://www.placer.ca.gov/1389/Business-Licenses
- Reviewed by multiple departments (Planning, Engineering & Surveying, Environmental Health, etc)

TCPUD Goals

 Align and follow TRPA Shorezone Code rules and regulations and Placer County Business License requirements (Ordinance #No. 307 - Parking and Use Regulations at the Lake Forest Boat Ramp Facility)

Commercial Vessel Pass Requirements

- TRPA Permit File Number
- Placer County Business License
- Purchase Commercial Vessel Season \$1,600 per vessel
- Provide proof of:
 - General Liability Insurance
 - Commercial Marine Liability Insurance
 - Automobile Liability Insurance
 - Worker's Compensation Insurance (If you have employees)

Commercial Vessel Season Pass Purchase Process

- Complete:
 - 2023 Commercial Vessel Season Pass Application
 - Lake Forest Boat Ramp Agreement and Rules for Commercial Vessel Use
 - Provide required documentation

TCPUD Ordinance No. 307 Parking and Use Regulations at the Lake Forest Boat Ramp Facility

What activity is permitted for Commercial Vessels?

 Commercial operators <u>are permitted to launch and retrieve vessels</u> with a TCPUD Commercial Vessel Season Pass

What activity is not permitted for Commercial Vessels?

- Use of pier
- Use of dock
- Use of parking lot for commercial operations or customer parking
- Loading/unloading or launching of customers

What is an example of Commercial Activity?

 Includes but is not limited to vessels used for renting, chartering, guided or chartered fishing.

TCPUD Ordinance No. 307 Parking and Use Regulations at the Lake Forest Boat Ramp Facility

What if I violate the Ordinance?

- Immediate cancellation of vessel's season pass, and all other vessel passes, vehicles and trailers affiliated with the person or entity violating the Ordinance
- TRPA and Placer County will be notified of violation
