

Bocce Ball is a casual and low-impact sport that is usually played on a hard packed soil or paved court with plastic balls about the size of a softball. Easy to learn, social, affordable and strategic, this centuries-old pastime began in Italy. Over the last decade, Bocce has been growing in popularity in the Tahoe Sierra as more restaurants, golf courses, and community spaces have been building courts for locals and guests. The success and growth of Bocce Ball has been seen at the Tahoe City Public Utility District. One night of Bocce Ball is offered this autumn and the summer 2020 series is expanded to three nights a week to accommodate the demand. The Bocce Ball courts were built in 2014 at the Tahoe City Golf Course at the request of the community.

Permanent pickleball courts served into play at Kilner Park

Still time to enjoy Pickleball

Pickleball, a wildly popular sport for all ages, is now available full-time at Tahoe City's Kilner Park. The game combines elements of tennis, badminton and ping-pong, and is played with a paddle and wiffle ball in singles or in teams of two. If you've never played, come play in Tahoe City!

The Tahoe City Public Utility District planned the pickleball court construction in conjunction with a tennis court resurfacing project. During the project, one of the two tennis courts was converted to four permanent pickleball courts, and temporary pickleball courts striping was added to the other tennis court. Kilner Park now offers both pickleball and tennis for public enjoyment.

TCPUD hosted a grand opening and ribbon-cutting in July 2019 at the new pickleball courts with over 30 players of all ages and abilities attending including three past national champions, Matthew Blom (USA Champion), Emanuel Sanchez

(Mexico Champion), and Ron Schmeck, USA's oldest pickleball champion at 88 years old.

Kilner Park is 3.5 miles south of Tahoe City on the corner of Highway 89 and Ward Avenue. This wooded 7-acre park adjacent to the west shore bike trail has a playground, lighted tennis and pickleball courts, a sand volleyball court, walking and biking trails, picnic tables, group BBQ area, and restrooms. The public pickleball and tennis courts are open daily this fall from 8am to 10pm.

Commons Beach Group BBQ

400 North Lake Boulevard

This ADA accessible group BBQ area with lake views is available year-round (weather conditions permitting) and accommodates up to 75 people. It offers eight large picnic tables (4' x 8'), a large stone BBQ with serving areas, running water, and electricity. Rent the Group BBQ area only or combine it with the Amphitheater. Combined maximum capacity is 140. Snow removal is not provided.

Commons Beach Amphitheater

400 North Lake Boulevard

The Commons Beach Amphitheater is available year-round (weather conditions permitting), and accommodates up to 65 people. It offers 4 rows of seating, an ADA accessible stage, and electricity. Rent the amphitheater only or combine it with the Group BBQ area. Combined maximum capacity is 140. Snow removal is not provided.

Fairway Community Center

330 Fairway Drive, Tahoe City

The Fairway Community Center is located close to downtown Tahoe City and overlooks the Tahoe City Golf Course. Lakeview or Tessie Rooms are a great location for year-round birthday parties or other private events. The facility is used for church services, Yoga, Aikido, Tai Chi, Tang Soo Do, and other programs.

Kilner Park

Hwy 89 & Ward Avenue

Kilner Park offers tennis court (lighted), four pickleball courts (lighted), playground, sand volleyball court, access to walking and biking trails, and group picnic areas for rent. Rent one space or all spaces. The group picnic area accommodates up to 50. The park is closed in winter but make reservations early for spring/summer 2020 as it books up quickly.

Heritage Plaza

Downtown Tahoe City, 570 North Lake Boulevard Heritage Plaza is open year-round and offers picnic tables, benches, and spectacular Lake Tahoe views. The Plaza is a popular gathering spot and central location for many seasonal community activities and events. It is the perfect spot to rent for a casual wedding, a family picnic or a winter snowman party.

Skylandia Park & Beach

90 Aspen Street

The traditional home of Camp Skylandia, this beautiful 24acre California State Park is operated by TCPUD and offers biking and hiking trails, sandy beach and swimming area, and a pier. Three group picnic areas with running water and restrooms are available. Parking is very limited. This park is open in winter for hiking, snow shoeing and XC skiing. Reserve the space early for spectacular lakeview weddings as it books up quickly.

Pomin Park

2500 Lake Forest Road

Pomin Park, located next to Lake Forest Campground and Boat Ramp, offers a large athletic field, playground, a picnic area, restrooms, and batting cage. Limited parking. Open dawn to dusk spring, summer, and fall. Perfect location for a family event.

Highlands Community Center, Tahoe XC Ski Center & Mountain Bike Trails

925 Country Club Drive

Enjoy biking in summer and fall on the Highlands Mountain Bike trails, which includes 45 acres with varied terrain. Bike rentals and bike maintenance is available during select hours at the Highlands Community Center. Crosscountry skiing offered in winter.

64-Acres

165 West Lake Boulevard

64-Acres is US Forest Service land developed, operated and maintained by TCPUD, and is located just south of the wye in Tahoe City. It offers parking, picnicking, restrooms, plus access to the multi-use trails, the Truckee River, and rafting. The park is located next to the Tahoe City Transit Center.

Bell's Landing

Located next to River Ranch Restaurant and Lodge on the Truckee River. Bell's Landing is primarily used for public and commercial rafters floating the Truckee River during summer and fall.

Elizabeth Williams Park

Four miles south of Tahoe City on Hwy 89

Elizabeth Williams Park has long been a favorite of anglers. The park is located just north of Kaspian Campground and offers multi-use trail access, a pier, lake access for swimming, and picnic areas with BBQs.

Lake Forest Beach Park

End of Bristlecone Street in Lake Forest

This park is a popular spot for swimming, bird watching, horseshoes, picnics, windsurfing, and simply enjoying the incredible lake views. Parking is very limited especially in snow conditions.

Marie Sluchak Park

Corner of Pine Street and Wilson Ave, Tahoma

This park is the future home of a new state-of-the-art playground. It offers a stage and seating area, and is jointly operated by the Tahoe Cedars Property Owners Association and TCPUD. Church services and live music is offered by the POA in the summer. Santa arrives the first weekend in December on a Meeks Bay Fire engine.

Gateway Park

Located at the wye in Tahoe City

Watch the fish and enjoy the views from this park yearround. Visitors can explore the interpretive historic signage and a path to enjoy the Lake Tahoe Outlet Dam.

Tahoe City Dog Park

211 Grove Street, Tahoe City

The Humane Society of Truckee-Tahoe and local community members teamed up with TCPUD to give dogs a contained space to socialize and exercise. The Tahoe City Dog Park is open daily from dawn to dusk, from spring through snow fall. Please pick up after and keep an eye on your dogs at all times.

Lake Forest Campground

Lake Forest Road and Hwy 89

Lake Forest Campground offers 20 spots on a first-come, first-served basis for \$20 per night. Portable restrooms and pump water are available. No reservations required and the campground does not offer showers, hookups or a dump station. Limit of 10 consecutive days. Maximum vehicle length is 25 feet. Open May 1 to October 15 (weather permitting).

The trail system includes the West and North Shores of Lake Tahoe and along the Truckee River to Squaw Valley.

Enjoy 23 miles of multi-use recreational trails open to bicyclists, e-bikes, walkers, joggers, strollers, and more. Please leash your dogs, watch for maintenance workers and equipment, and be respectful of other users.

During winter, the TCPUD parks crew will keep portions of the trail clear, from Dollar Hill down the West Shore to Sequoia Avenue, and the Truckee River Trail to the Squaw Valley intersection conditions permitting. Be sure to watch for icy patches during winter months.
