Dianne Feinstein West Shore Tahoe Trail Reconstruction Begins

\$3.5 million investment will improve trail experience for all users.

WHAT: Contractors for TCPUD will reconstruct 1.4 miles of trail between Tahoe City and Sunnyside.

The project will:

- Pulverize and repave approximately 80% of this trail section
- Widen the trail to nine feet where feasible
- Add new signage, striping, railings, slope adjustments, and other safety enhancements

WHY: Originally built in the 1970s, the West Shore Trail has benefited from TCPUD's ongoing preventative maintenance, but after nearly 50 years, a full reconstruction is necessary.

WHEN: Construction is scheduled to start with tree removal in April and last through October 2026.

WHAT TO EXPECT: A number of trees along the highway will be removed at the start of the project due to safety and conflict with the trail alignment.

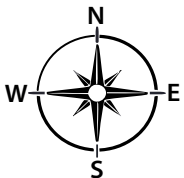
During peak construction, there may be full trail closures on this segment. However, no construction will occur on weekends, on Fridays in July and August, and from June 27 to July 12. During these times, the trail will either remain open or have detour options available.

Neighbors may experience associated construction activity and noise. Access to homes and businesses will be maintained, though brief restrictions may occur. Crews will work to minimize disruptions.

Tahoe Cedars Water System Reconstruction Project Set to Begin



Rebuilding the Tahoe Cedars Water System is the largest capital investment in District history. The existing water system, first built over 60 years ago is actively failing.

This multi-year project will:

- Replace 15 miles of undersized and failing water mains with new streetside water mains and service laterals.
- Install 144 fire hydrants across the system, including additional hydrants in areas that previously lacked coverage.
- Install over 1,200 residential water meters.

TCPUD expects to begin construction of Phase 1 of this project in Summer 2026, with subsequent phases planned through 2031.

Madden Creek Water System Reconstruction Project Continues in 2026

This is a critical investment in water system reliability and community safety for the Homewood community.

Upon completion, the project will deliver 3.5 miles of new water mains, 52 fire hydrants bringing the neighborhood up to modern fire suppression standards, and modern metering for all connections.
