

TCPUD BOARD ADOPTS 2017 BUDGET AND NEW RATES

At the November 18, 2016 board meeting, the TCPUD Board of Directors unanimously approved the 2017 annual budget. Budget highlights include: a total operating budget for 2017 of \$10.4 million, a capital budget for new infrastructure projects of \$17.6 million, of which \$2.1 million is to come from grant funding. Additionally, the District will pay debt service of \$783,709, which includes the retirement of a \$2M Zions First National Bank loan from 2007. These funds were used for past water and sewer capital projects.



The Board also approved new water and sewer rates, which included keeping sewer rates below 2016 approved proposition 218 levels and adopting the proposed proposition 218 water rates for 2017. In 2017, a standard residential customer (3/4 inch service meter) will see an increase of just \$3.75 for their water service base rate (additional increases in water costs are based on consumption) and \$1.54 for sewer service per month. As always, direction from the Board is for TCPUD staff to continue to keep operating costs as low as possible.

NEW! ICE RINK AND FOOD & BEVERAGE AT THE WINTER SPORTS PARK!

This year the Tahoe City Winter Sports Park boasts a brand new seasonal ice rink. The ice rink is 50' x 80'(4,000 square feet), approximately the same size as a basketball court. The new ice skating facility features real ice, skating aids, and a complete skate rental inventory. The rink opened on December 10th and will operate through March, weather and conditions permitting. Residents can purchase Winter Sports Park season passes for only \$95 for adults 13 and older and \$65 for kids 12 and under. Ice skating season passes are only \$49 for adults and \$39 for kids. Season passes can be purchased at <u>register.tahoexc.org</u>. If all-season access isn't what you are looking for, day rates for ice skating start at only \$5. The ice rink and winter sports park is a great option when the ski conditions aren't optimal at the resorts or just for a change of pace.

Also new is Café Zenon, the park's food and beverage operation. Café Zenon is owned and operated by Suzanne Nguyen, owner of Zia Lina in Tahoe City. Café Zenon will be serving breakfast on weekends, lunch, dinner and operating a full bar. Come in and check out the excellent new menu!

In addition to the ice rink, the park will continue to offer the sledding hill, 4 km of dog friendly cross country ski trails, groomed daily for skate or traditional cross country



skiing, as well as a snowshoe loop (fat bikes allowed). All day park passes are available so come try out the new and improved winter sports park this winter!! Additional details about the Sports Park and Café Zenon can be found at <u>www.wintersportspark.com</u>.
