

Important 2020 Information

- Camp 2020 dates are July 6 August 14.
- You must register your child in the group according to the grade they will enter in the 2020-21 school year.
- · Payment must be made with registration before drop off.
- Drop-ins are not permitted if space is available. There are no field trip days.
- Parents must complete an updated emergency contact information form at the beginning of each session.
- · A birth certificate may be required to verify age of child.
- There are no camp overnights or After Camp.
- Air Quality TCPUD will monitor air quality conditions in the event of nearby fires affecting our area. If we need to cancel camp due to poor air quality, we will communicate closures by 7am.





Bob Bonino



The Tahoe City Golf Course and its manager Bob Bonino have a long history together. Bob is the grandson of Carl and Elise Bechdolt, who owned the course from 1948 to 2012. Bob was nearly born on the 3rd green of the course when his mom went into labor playing golf. He spent his early years living in Tahoe City, attending Tahoe Lake School and learning the game of golf.

At 13, he moved to San Francisco and continued to pursue golf, playing in high school, junior college, and at the University of San Francisco, where he received a degree in Hospitality Management. In 1987, Bob was asked by his aunt to run the Tahoe City Golf Course, which he did until 2004.

In 2012, the Bechdolt Family sold the course to TCPUD and partners. Since 2017, Bob has served as the course manager. To Bob it's more fun than work. He not only holds a wealth of knowledge about our community golf course but also understands the importance of the hospitality aspect of the game.

Youth Sailing (10+ Years)

Young sailors will learn basic water safety, boating skills, knots, right-of-way rules, docking, breaching, tacking, gybing and rigging depending on the level. Youth Sailing Levels, Descriptions, and Requirements:

Novice - For students new to sailing. No Novice sessions will be offered Summer 2020.

Intermediate - For students looking to increase their sailing skills. Must be able to recover a capsized boat and execute controlled tacks and gybes, understand basic sail trim, and ability to make headway upwind.

Advanced - For proficient sailors needing to advance their sailing skills. Students will sail Picos with one sailor per boat and 420/FJs with two sailors per boat. Must be able to make precise tacks with little over/under steering, avoid unplanned gybes and feel comfortable controlling a heeling Pico and 420/FJ in moderate shifty winds.





Elizabeth Williams Park has long been a favorite of anglers. The park is located just north of Kaspian Campground and offers multi-use trail access, a pier, lake access for swimming, and picnic areas with BBQs.

Lake Forest Beach Park

End of Bristlecone Street in Lake Forest

This park is a popular spot for swimming, bird watching, horseshoes, picnics, windsurfing, and simply enjoying the incredible lake views. Parking is very limited.

Lake Forest Campground

Lake Forest Road and Hwy 89

Twenty campsites available on a first-come, first-served basis for \$20 per night. No reservations. Portable restrooms and pump water available, no showers, hookups or dump station. Limit 10 consecutive days. Maximum vehicle length 25 feet. Open May 1 to October 15 (weather permitting)

Marie Sluchak Park

Corner of Pine Street and Wilson Ave, Tahoma

The future home of a new state-of-the-art playground. It offers a stage and seating area, and is jointly operated by the Tahoe Cedars Property Owners Association and the TCPUD. Church services and live music are offered.

Gateway Park

Commons Beach Group BBQ

400 North Lake Boulevard

This ADA accessible group BBQ area with lake views is available year-round (weather conditions permitting) and accommodates up to 75 people. It offers eight large picnic tables (4' x 8'), a large stone BBQ with serving areas, running water, and electricity. Rent the Group BBQ area only or combine it with the Amphitheater. Combined maximum capacity is 140. Snow removal is not provided.

Commons Beach Amphitheater

400 North Lake Boulevard

The Commons Beach Amphitheater is available year-round (weather conditions permitting), and accommodates up to 65 people. It offers 4 rows of seating, an ADA accessible stage, and electricity. Rent the amphitheater only or combine it with the Group BBQ area. Combined maximum capacity is 140. Snow removal is not provided.

Fairway Community Center

330 Fairway Drive

The Fairway Community Center is located close to downtown Tahoe City and overlooks the Tahoe City Golf Course. Lakeview or Tessie Rooms are a great location for year-round birthday parties or other private events. The facility is used for church services, Yoga, Aikido, Tai Chi, Tang Soo Do, and other programs.

Kilner Park

Hwy 89 & Ward Avenue

Kilner Park offers tennis court (lighted), four pickleball courts (lighted), playground, sand volleyball court, access to walking and biking trails, and group picnic areas for rent. Rent one space or all spaces. The group picnic area accommodates up to 50. The park is closed in winter but make reservations early for spring/summer 2020 as it books up quickly.

Heritage Plaza

Downtown Tahoe City, 570 North Lake Boulevard

Heritage Plaza is open year-round and offers picnic tables, benches, and spectacular Lake Tahoe views. The Plaza is a popular gathering spot and central location for many seasonal community activities and events. It is the perfect spot to rent for a casual wedding, a family picnic or a winter snowman party.

The traditional home of Camp Skylandia, this beautiful 24-acre California State Park is operated by the TCPUD and offers biking and hiking trails, sandy beach and swimming area, and a pier. Reserve the space early for spectacular lakeview weddings as it books up quickly.



The TCPUD Multi-Use Trail System includes 23-miles of class one trails across the West and North Shores of Lake Tahoe and along the Truckee River to Squaw Valley.

Every summer since 2005, a team of TCPUD staff, partner agencies, and community volunteers administer trail surveys and user counts at four locations within the trail system. The survey data provides valuable information the TCPUD uses to evaluate and prioritize improvement opportunities that further the public's enjoyment of the trail system. A few highlights from the 2019 survey results include:

- 91% of respondents claim the trails play a significant positive role in North Lake Tahoe enjoyment.
- 76% of respondents indicated they have, or would use the trails in the winter. (TCPUD clears 10+ miles)
- 48% of respondents would have used a car for their trip had they not been using the trails.
- 11% of respondents were using Class-1 or Class-2 electric bikes.
